What is Neighbor Ride's Inclement Weather Policy?

To ensure the safety of our drivers and passengers, either the driver or the passenger may cancel a ride by calling the Neighbor Ride office. In questionable weather, even if the driver is willing to drive, he/she will contact the passenger to confirm that the ride is still needed. If the ride is cancelled, the driver will contact Neighbor Ride. If possible, the Neighbor Ride office will remain open to handle notification of cancellations. Payments for cancelled rides are refunded by crediting passengers' accounts.



Remember to Delete Your Old Voicemails

Our Ride Coordinators have been finding it difficult to leave messages for passengers due to full voicemail boxes. Please remember to take a moment to delete old voicemails so that we can pass important ride information on to you.

Ride Rate Schedule

Fees are determined by the one-way distance, per Google Maps, between the pick-up location and destination. If you are a Veteran or your income is limited, you may be eligible for subsidized rides. Please call the Neighbor Ride office for more information or to request an application.

In 2006 the World Health Organization developed the idea of an age-friendly community. Since that time more than 1,100 communities worldwide have joined the movement to ensure their environments foster health, well-being, and participation of people as they age.

In Howard County, being agefriendly means addressing the aging of our community in a way that is inclusive of the needs of older adults and persons with disabilities; and it means that when addressing those needs and interests, it improves the community for individuals of all ages, races, ethnicities, and walks of life. The Age-Friendly Action Plan will bring together individuals, professional and civic groups, businesses, faith communities, and government




agencies to look through this new lens to plan, restructure, build, communicate, and serve all the residents of the county.

The work groups who developed the 80+ items in the Action Plan were comprised of more than 100 volunteer members of the community from many different professions, some still working, others retired, but all committed to developing a sound plan for the future.

At a press conference on January 25th announcing AARP's approval and the kick-off to



implement the Action Plan, County Executive Ball stated, "When we make our community more walkable, provide better options to connect and engage with one another, and support more accessible housing – people of all ages benefit. With AARP's



stamp of approval, we can move forward confidently and work to ensure all recommendations can be implemented."

The plan is ready to be implemented and there is a role for everyone to be part of making the action items a reality. Individuals of all ages and ability levels can be part of groups that will determine how to make these wonderful ideas come to fruition.
